Owned and operated by the Wilks Family since 1982, Nighthawk Alarm Services offers the latest technology, installation and monitoring for residential and commercial security, video surveillance, security and safety products, and medical panic devices. And a truly fabulous holiday display that brightens even a rainy night.

Additionally, several customer reviews note that local 24-hour monitoring is a true benefit. This makes Nighthawk's response times exceptional. Out-of-area monitoring centers can have a

harder time dealing with small jurisdictions they don't know well, so don't always dispatch from the right precinct.

Nighthawk customers are located throughout the Pacific Northwest. While the bulk of their accounts are in the Portland-Salem area, larger accounts can be located anywhere from the Oregon Coast to Seattle and Eugene. Significantly, the team at Nighthawk has been very successful in establishing strong connections to their satisfied customers — so much so that referrals are

This 1947 photograph shows the intersection where the main road through Carver splits off toward the Carver Bridge. The leftmost building above is Clifton's Service Station (Nighthawk Alarm Systems today). Next door to that is Baker's Bridge Trading Post. Across the highway is the former Carver State Bank/ Mumpy's Tavern (now the Carver Hangar).

The service station continued to sell gas for many years. In fact, local residents recall pulling in there during the 1970s oil embargo, waiting in line for a turn to pump gas, and purchasing the 10-gallon maximum for all of \$3.00. Remember the days of odd- or evennumbered license plates determining which day you could buy gas?

The Clifton Service Station was used as a rafting rental shop before being remodeled to become The Trails End Gallery, which is now the home of the security company.

Today, this intersection is regulated by a traffic signal that controls traffic through Carver and over the bridge. The signal light is right in front of the Nighthawk building — if you stop there during the holidays, take a picture!
